LET'S READ!

When children learn to then continue to read, they open the door to a big, exciting world. As a parent, you can

begin an endless learning chain when you support your child's reading. When you read to your children, they develop a love of stories and poems. They then want to read on their own. As they willingly practice reading, they begin to read for their own information or pleasure. When children become readers, their world is forever wider and richer.

To support strong beginning reading skills, here are some strategies to try at home:

- Read aloud to children try books, newspapers and magazines articles, the back of the cereal box, labels on cans, or directions - any written word will work!
- Read poems aloud both solo and together.
 Poems help children learn about rhythm and repeated sounds in language.
- Point to the words on the page as they are read, move the fingers from left to right.
- Listen to child read every day they can read their homework or favorite stories.
- Go to the library together Check out books and be sure to ask the librarian for recommendations appropriate for your child's age and skill level.
- Have books, magazines, and papers around the house - let your child see that you like to read, too.

If your child has trouble reading words, you can help in several ways:

- Supply the word and keep reading enjoyment is the main goal.
- Have your child skip over the word, read the rest of the sentence, and ask what word would make sense in the story; or
- Have your child use what they know about letters and the sounds they make to sound out the word.

To support those already reading, try these strategies:

- Encourage experienced reader to read to those just learning.
- Discuss a book's story elements (character, setting, plot, theme).
- Request a written book summary.

Regardless of the skill level of the reader you are supporting, set aside time every day devoted to reading.


