We have not involved an outside vendor and the shop will be entirely run by the PTO (gifts have been purchased ahead of time!) This enabled us to personalize gifts for our small Saint Bridget community. The event will have a new framework that adheres to COVID guidelines and will become a special annual event that children can celebrate for years to come. We are excited to bring the spirit of giving to our school at such a special time!

The name of our shop is Candy Cane Lane. It was chosen with our Catholic faith in mind:

EVENT DETAILS:

- All gifts will cost \$3.50.
- Candy Cane Lane will be held on Thursday, December 10th and Friday, December 11th.
 You child will shop during school hours at their scheduled time.
- The shop will be open to grades JK-5 and remote students.
- There will be Christmas music, fake snow, lights, balloons, games, etc. The event will be very festive and fun!
- There will be gifts for Mom, Dad, grandparents, siblings, friends, and pets!

LOGISTICS:

- $1. \ \ \, \text{On Monday November 30}^{\text{th}} \, \text{gift tags will come home with each child in their folder}.$
- 2. Your family will make a decision as to how many tags you would like to purchase, and the child will address/label the front of the tags at home.
- 3. Please return the addressed tags by December $4^{\text{th.}}$ (For example, if the child purchased 4 tags x \$3.50 = \$14.00 cash or check made out to PTO.)
- 4. If your family would like more to purchase more than 8 gift tags there will be extra sheets available in the office.
- 5. The tags will be redistributed along with a shopping bag to your child during their allotted time at the shop.
